The History Corner

The Reverend Robert S. Moran Mausoleum: As you enter Oakdale Cemetery at the end of Fifteenth Street and proceed north down the main thoroughfare referred to as Jones Avenue, you will eventually notice the mausoleum of the Reverend Robert S. Moran. It is on the right side of the thoroughfare after the Hugh MacRae and the William R. Kenan plots with his name "Moran" cut into the stone.



The Moran Mausoleum, built under the supervision of James F. Post, was the first erected in Oakdale Cemetery in late 1892. The ten by ten foot structure with a brown stone front and a combination of brick and concrete side and back walls is covered with a concrete roof. The floor is also of concrete. The entrance at

one time had heavy oak doors and iron grated gates that remain today. It is estimated that the total cost was \$1,000.

The glass covered casket in which Reverend Moran was interred was placed in a marble covered sarcophagus in which the sarcophagus cover could easily slide open for visitors to view his remains. At some point in time, the family, friends or authorities

decided that the ability to view Reverend Moran's remains was not appropriate and the sarcophagus cover was permanently stabilized.

Reverend Moran died in New York City in April 1862 and his remains were transported to Wilmington, North Carolina per his request. Funeral services were conducted at the Grace Methodist Church and attended by a very large group of friends, relatives and fellow ministers. After the service, Reverend Moran's remains were temporarily interred in the deRosset vault until the mausoleum was completed in December 1862.

Reverend Moran served the Front Street Methodist Church in Wilmington; a Salisbury, North Carolina Church; the Fifth Avenue Methodist Church in Wilmington returning to the Front Street Methodist Church after it was renamed the Grace Methodist Church. Because Reverend Moran tired of travel and relocating to a new congregation each year, he decided to reside permanently at one location but continued to serve as a minister for those who welcomed him.
