CREMATION

Cremation is becoming more popular every day and Oakdale is very much aware of this. Recently, we have experienced several incidents of disposing of cremains that were done without the authorization of the Superintendent as stated in Oakdale's Rules and Regulations. Please be reminded that ALL burials (either casket or cremations) require a burial permit authorization and fee to be paid. <u>Any scattering or disposal of</u> cremains without authorization is prohibited and fines will be enforced by the Board of Directors.

As a reminder, the Rules and Regulations state....Cremation Rule #24 "Any person who deposits cremains at a grave site without the prior written permission of the Superintendent and without paying the required fees shall be required to pay the current fee for cremation burials PLUS a fine equal to 25% of the current fee for cremation burials."

For the past few years, the Board of Directors has been discussing options for cremation. Plans are "in the works" for construction of a Memorial Garden for cremains which we hope will be a reality before too much longer.
